## Call for Papers

In cooperation with its new host, the University of Bern, TREE (Transitions from Education to Employment) cordially invites you to its 3<sup>rd</sup> International Conference. The planned conference is conceived as a platform for scientific exchange among researchers working with longitudinal data in the fields of youth and young adulthood, school-to-work and other relevant biographical transitions as well as life course research in general. Within this general topical field, the conference warmly welcomes contributions

- focusing on school-to-work transitions;
- covering further transitional dimensions such as leaving the parental home and family formation, health issues, values and attitudes, well-being and satisfaction;
- analysing cross-domain effects between the school-to-work dimension and other dimensions of transition;
- furthering comparative research, not only in the field of data analysis, but also with regard to methodological issues such as cohort/sample or survey designs. This includes contributions with comparative analysis designs as well as contributions which especially lend themselves to be extended to such a design. Comparisons may cover any combination of datasets, cohorts, countries, topical and/or methodological issues.
- analysing longitudinal datasets which include standardised cognitive and literacy measures at various – preferably repeated – points of observation throughout educational pathways and the life course.

The conference language is English only. Until **28 February 2017**, you are cordially invited to submit

- single paper abstracts (250-500 words)
- abstracts for symposia (90 minutes workshops with, as a rule, three topically related presentations; 500-1000 words)
- proposals for posters
