Youth and Young Adulthood: Transitions in the 2nd and 3rd Decade of Life

The conference offers a platform for scientific exchange among researchers working with longitudinal survey data covering crucial transition phases during youth and young adulthood. Beyond school-to-work transitions, it aims at exploring further dimensions of transition, e.g. leaving the parental home, family formation, health issues, values and attitudes, well-being, and satisfaction. Cross-domain effects between the school-to-work dimension and other dimensions of transition during the 2nd and 3rd decade of the life course are of particular interest.
